ParaTrack



Display:

- clear visibility in sunlight, wet conditions, icing, extreme cold
- precise information display, even in stressful situations
- intuitive, easy to understand navigation data



Operation:

- three backlight buttons – easy to see and feel
- choose anytime between five targets
- self adjustable display brightness or manual setting



Housing:

- compact design, lowest possible weight, high rigidity
- 4 mm polycarbonate front panel
- high-tensile aluminum, weather proof (IP65)
- made to withstand extreme conditions



Attachment:

- equipped with X-Shut SPIDER mount
- can be attached to MOLLE body armor or our carrier plate
- can be folded back for safety and clear sight at landing



Energy Management:

- can run on rechargeable or primary batteries
- special low-temperature batteries provided as standard
- very low power consumption (10 hrs operation at night)
- battery voltage can be checked at any time
- display fallback procedure in low power situation



Data Integrity:

- stored coordinates protected against modification
- wireless "Mission Data Transfer" software
- "Data Kill" function deletes all coordinates after the mission
